Letter from the 2016 AIA|DC President, Sean Stadler, AIA

As my Presidency wraps up I wanted to take a moment to reflect in all that we have accomplished in this past year and thank all of our members and Chapter staff that continue to contribute to the success of the DAC. In a year that we celebrated 5 years at the DAC I have really grown to appreciate what it is the DAC really means to our community and our members. The DAC has really become the heart and spirit of the architectural community in a way we never had. To walk into the DAC on any given day you may run into an outside group teaching a seminar, school age children learning to design, or preparing our next generation of leaders.

The many things that we have accomplished this year begin with the board's strategic vision and the leadership of our executive director Mary Fitch.

We know that our members and their Clients have been affected by the extremely slow process of getting building permits. This year we've been working with the Department of Energy and Environment to try and streamline their process. The chapter has been bringing to light the difficulties and lengthy review process and will continue to demand this process improves. In order to get more people to write about local architectural issues the Chapter developed the Conroy Prize. Named for Sarah Booth Conroy, a reporter for the Washington Post, this prize encourages criticism and reporting that helps inform the public about Washington's built environment. Our first prize was generously donated by Shalom Baranes Associates and was awarded to Kriston Capps.

This year we also refreshed our website. It was definitely time to make it more useful to our members, but much more importantly for the public. We wanted to make sure that our website was easier to find the things you and the public are looking for. We also wanted to make it much more engaging and graphic in nature. Since we know architects are visual by nature we spent a lot of effort to make sure the website had great images of architecture, and was not just page after page of text as our old website was.

Design is huge for our members. It's the reason most of us got into this profession, so it's essential that the public understand the value of design. Our Design Excellence Committee and Staff put an emphasis on getting the public to understand what we do rather than just celebrate an award. Unbuilt was expanded this year and included some amazing submissions from both our local design schools and professionals. We also created ISEEDC to involve the public in photographing the built environment. The purpose of the contest is to raise public awareness of the built environment in Washington, DC and encourage them to explore how design inspires, creates order, transforms, delights, or creates a sense of place. Our exhibitions generated tons of interest and some of the exhibits we have had this year include; *Hybrid Realities: Sensing Space in the Modern World; Sketchbook: The Art of Drawing, Works by Hany Hassan, FAIA; Built to Scale;* and *Wood Furniture for Public Spaces, Furniture Designed by Tom Shiner, FAIA.*

We are equipping our members and the public with timely and relevant education with great events such as DesignDC and Hi-Rise Wood: Building Tall with Timber.

The DAC has been such a terrific catalyst for the Chapter to accomplish our mission and engage our community in a constant dialog about the value of design. I have had the pleasure of leading the chapter this year and look forward to what the next five years will be like at the DAC.

Award Deadlines

Sarah Booth Conroy Prize for Journalism and Architectural Criticism

Deadline: December 31, 2016, 11:59 PM

The Sarah Booth Conroy Prize for Journalism and Architectural Criticism rewards reportorial or critical excellence in fostering a better public understanding of architecture and urbanism in Washington DC. This journalism prize is funded by the Washington Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA | DC) and seeks to raise DC's status as a design city by rewarding journalists and critics who write about the design of DC's urban environment.

The 2016 prize is generously supported by the District Architecture Center's 5th Anniversary Capital Campaign.

Prize: The annual prize amount shall be \$5,000. If more than one prize, or different levels of the prize (such as Honorable Mention) are determined by the jury it is up to the jury to decide the prize money will be divided, if at all.

Tritschler Prize

Deadline: January 16, 2017, 11:59 PM

This scholarship prize will be awarded to an advanced architecture student who has shown particular provess in relating modern design to historic context. The scholarship seeks to encourage architecture programs throughout the United States to focus on this area of practice. The scholarship honors Gerry Tritschler, AIA, a former Principal at Shalom Baranes Associates, who spent his career focused on rehabilitating historic buildings.

The scholarship is open to advanced undergraduate and graduate architecture students. If undergraduate, the scholarship would apply to the fifth year of an accredited professional program. If graduate, the scholarship would apply to second or third year of graduate study.

Prize: \$25,000 and an internship at Shalom Baranes Associates to be awarded every three years beginning in 2017.




