Fall Design Fête Honorees

The Fall Design Fête is a great party but it is also the time where we honor those who have done great service to the Chapter, the profession and the City. Just four awards are presented at the Fête:

The 2017 Emerging Architect Award will be presented to Leah Ijjas, AIA.

This award honors exceptional leadership early in a career. Leah is an architect at Gensler and has played a very active role in the Chapter's Emerging Architects Committee (EAC). She showed early promise in 2011 at the University of Maryland when she led the team that won first place in the US Energy Department's Solar Decathlon. Since graduating she has been an active participant in EAC, including chairing the committee this year. She is a graduate of the Christopher Kelley Leadership Development Program and participated in the AIA's Leadership Institute.

The 2017 John 'Wieb' Wiebenson Award for Architecture in the Public Interest will be presented to Joanna Schmickel, AIA. Joanna Schmickel is a principal at cox graae + spack architects providing leadership for projects encompassing interior design services as well as planning and design for education facilities. She is being given this award for her volunteer activities with the Foundation's programs for kids including Architecture in the Schools and a popular class in stage set design. Most recently, she founded the Design Like a Girl Mentor program that matches young women with female AEC practitioners. Design Like a Girl starts its second year long program in September.

The Glenn Brown Award for Improving the quality of life in DC and raising awareness of its benefits to society will be presented to Elinor Bacon.

Elinor brought her 30 years of experience in housing, real estate development, and community development in the public and private sectors to DC's Wharf project. In addition, she has served as deputy assistant secretary of the US Department of Housing and Urban Development, as president and CEO of the National Capital Revitalization Corporation, a public real estate development corporation established by the Washington, DC, Council, with the mission to spur economic development throughout the District, primarily in neighborhoods of need. She founded her real estate and consulting firm in 2002 and has participated in many projects bringing great design and investment to Washington including *(continued on page 3)*

ANNUAL MEETING RECAP

Tommy Wells Speaks

AIA | DC held its annual business meeting on Wednesday, September 13th. A robust turnout was buoyed by an energizing speech from Tommy Wells, Director of DC's Department of Energy and the Environment. Construction in the District has flourished since many plots of federal land were recently released for development. Thanks to AIA | DC members, DC buildings are expending much less energy and the juice they require is coming from an increasingly renewable mix of sources.

The annual business meeting also included reports from the Board. The Chapter is in a much improved financial situation from the same time in 2016 and its advocacy efforts have produced some good results: a joint conference with the DC Office of Planning and improved communication with DCRA.

Executive Committee Report

Over the past decade, the Chapter has worked hard to address the challenges we all face as professionals. AIA | DC provides great education and member opportunities engaging with the public through the District Architecture Center. All of this takes significant resources to sustain.

We've been diligent about reducing expenses, but for us to continue to provide the level of service our members expect while laying a firm foundation for the future, the AIA | DC Board has concluded that overall revenue needs to increase. After careful consideration, the Board has decided to increase member dues, effective in the 2018 renewal cycle.

DC member dues will increase to \$440, for a total of \$711. Even with this increase, our dues will remain significantly lower than the rates for similar-sized chapters across the country and in our region.

In raising the dues, we also offer

- All members will be able to participate in professional education programs for free for three months beginning in January 2018.
- The Chapter will continue to provide a \$100 discount to architects who work for the government.
- There will be no further increases in local dues for at least three years.
- There will be no increase in local Associate dues. To ease the shift from Associate dues to full-member dues, a graduated dues program will transition to full-member dues over three years.

The Chapter deeply appreciates your continued support as members. We look forward to working together to provide relevant programming, services, and training that will help advance the profile and dialogue of architecture and design.

First Congregational Church of Christ and The Yards. Elinor was chosen for this honor for her ability to bring investment and local jobs to the communities in which these projects are done.

The highest award the Chapter can bestow is the Centennial award which this year goes to Hal Davis, FAIA.

Harold "Hal" E. Davis, Jr., FAIA, has made an indelible mark on the city of Washington, DC, and particularly on the National Mall. A practicing architect in the Washington region for more than 40 years, he was a partner of Tobey & Davis, which joined SmithGroupJJR in 1999. He is now Senior Vice President and Cultural Studio Leader Emeritus of SmithGroupJJR. Hal was made a Fellow of the American Institute of Architects in 2007 in recognition of his contributions to the architectural profession. He has been on the board of the Washington Architectural Foundation and currently serves as a Director-at-Large on the AIA | DC Board. Hal has led Architectural Engineering teams for the two newest museums to grace the National Mall, the National Museum of the American Indian and the National Museum of African American History and Culture. He has overseen planning and restoration on two of the Mall's oldest edifices, the Smithsonian Institution Building (the "Castle") and the Arts and Industries Building, and worked with the Architect of the Capitol to design the National Garden and Environmental Learning Center at the U.S. Botanic Garden. Millions of visitors tour these sites every year, directly benefiting from Hal's work for our country's national museums. His nomination letter captures his contribution very succinctly:

The Centennial Award makes reference to qualities of prosperity, unselfish effort, and contribution of time and talent "so that we all might benefit". For me, that's Hal's calling card.

Washington Architectural Foundation Wins Two Grants

This summer, the Washington Architectural Foundation was recognized twice for outstanding educational programs for children.

WAF received a \$1,500 grant from The Architects Foundation and Armstrong World Industries Foundation K-8 Architecture and Design Education competition for Architecture in the Schools, which is now celebrating its 25th year of work sending teams of volunteer architects into Washington metro area public school classrooms.

In August, WAF was one of two winners selected to receive a 2017 Opportunity Fund grant. The \$5,000 grant award is provided by Hanley Wood, publishers of *ARCHITECT* magazine, and will help support WAF's Design Like A Girl mentoring program. The program pairs girls ages 11-13 with female role models in the design fields.

Architecture in the Schools and Design Like a Girl trained new and returning volunteers in August. Both programs began in September.

We're proud that WAF's programs are being recognized as exemplary on the national level and grateful to all volunteers and donors who made this possible. We're always scouting for additional volunteers and donors who able to invest their time and dollars in making these very important programs possible. WAF programs are outstanding – and that's because we have terrific volunteers and supporters!

AIA DC Member Writes in Washington Post Praising **DC Waterfront Redevelopment**

In an interesting reflection on urban waterfront placemaking, Roger K. Lewis, FAIA, says DC's Anacostia River Waterfront is on the rise. In place of blighted brownfields and uninviting sidewalks now rise LEEDcertified residential, commercial, retail, and public recreation space.

"Along the Potomac River, only Georgetown's dense, mixed-use Washington Harbor complex directly engages the river, having enjoyed monopoly status since the 1980s as the only destination in Northwest Washington with direct water adjacency. But Washington Harbor now faces competition from Southeast's Capitol Riverfront and Washington Navy Yard area adjacent to the Anacostia River.

Upriver next to the Navy Yard, the 11th Street Bridge Park will span the Anacostia with new, landscaped pedestrian decks linking socioeconomically disparate Wards 6 and 8. Potentially animating both shores of the river, it will provide places to stroll, bike, relax, meet, perform, dine, display arts and crafts, and interact directly with the river below.

But the Wharf in Southwest will transform Washington's waterfront character most dramatically."

Washington Post Reviews Postcards Exhibition at DAC

The Washington Post's John Kelly: "I think my favorite postcard from the exhibition is one that shows the U.S. Capitol bathed in multicolored stripes of psychedelic light, from Creamsicle orange to patriotic red, white and blue. The caption reads, "Aurora Borealis illumination of United States Capitol, Washington, D.C." ... I did some sleuthing and it turns out that on Nov. 11, 1921 — and on the two following nights — a massive light show was held in Washington. It marked the opening of the world's first disarmament conference, held in our fair city. At 8 p.m. on the 11th, President Warren G. Harding stood on a platform in front of the Pan-American Building and threw a switch that powered illuminations from the Capitol to the Washington Monument, transforming the Mall into "a veritable fairy land." Shafts of light crisscrossed the skies in all directions. The display near the Capitol was meant to approximate the aurora borealis."


