### Hi Rise Wood

On Friday, September 16th, AIA | DC, in partnership with the George Mason University's Center for Real Estate Entrepreneurship, is hosting a very special day-long symposium, *High Rise Wood: Building Tall with Timber*, at the District Architecture Center. In my 20 plus years of practicing in Washington, I have never witnessed such an appropriate and applicable technology to our mid-rise rise city that is essentially unknown to the development community.

**Building Tall with Timber** 

The technology consists of dimensional lumber glued together in the same direction to create columns and beams (glulam) and in the opposite direction to make large panels for floors and walls (Cross Laminated Timber, or CLT). Just like a standing tree after a forest fire, the material is designed to build a layer of "char", which protects the wood from further damage, maintaining its structural integrity. Because the trees used to make glulams and CLT sequester carbon during their lifespan and store that carbon for the life of the building, a timber structure is actually carbon negative, making it one of the most sustainable and renewable building materials available. The wood is fabricated almost entirely offsite, reducing on-site labor size and time that is significantly faster and more efficient than concrete or steel. Wood technology is currently being tested for seismic and blast characteristics.

For the symposium we are bringing to Washington experts in CLT and glulam construction from Portland to London and between to share their experiences and introduce the system. The panel of speakers includes architects, an engineer, a developer, and a manufacturer. The panel will talk about projects in Europe, Australia, Canada, and a few in construction in the US with dozens more on the boards. We welcome architects, engineers, developers, lenders, attorneys, and public officials to attend the event to be a part of the coming of high rise wood to the DMV region. The event is sponsored by Fentress Architects and KLH (additional sponsors welcomed). Attendees will receive tickets to the opening reception of **Timber City: Innovations in Wood** at the National Building Museum on the same day.




